

Enhanced Hospice at Home

Information for individuals, primary carers, families and loved ones



Who are we?

If you would like to be supported in the comfort of your own home or a care home, our Enhanced Hospice at Home team will be there for you. You will receive the same standard of personalised palliative care you'd receive in the Hospice ward.



What do we do?

The service is designed to offer support to those individuals in their last few weeks of life. Working alongside your District Nursing team. The support given will be dependent on individual need.

The district nurse will be your main contact or 'key worker' and the Enhanced Hospice at Home team will work alongside them and any other healthcare professionals involved in your care. We are an additional service and do not replace any services you are already receiving.

Allocation of care is decided on an hourly basis and individual's are prioritised according to their clinical need and support requirement at that time.

The team will review the level of support required at each visit and reassessment of support will occur at approximately six weekly intervals.

Should your condition remain stable, Enhanced Hospice @ Home will discuss withdrawing the service. Support will be provided according to specialist palliative care need. Continuing care will be managed by your key worker. Enhanced Hospice at Home can be contacted again and a rereferral made at any time, if appropriate.

Assessment, phone call and first visit

Following a referral to the Enhanced Hospice at Home service the Co-ordinator will telephone you to arrange a visit and explain the implementation of the service.

On their first visit a member of the Enhanced Hospice at Home team will assess your needs and discuss how we might be able to support.

The Enhanced Hospice at Home team works in a holistic way and will liaise with your District Nurse, any other healthcare professionals involved in your care and other members of the multidisciplinary team at the hospice to help ensure your needs are met.
